- Our surgical center has been fully constructed with all surgical equipment installed and is ready for its grand opening near the end of the year. We hope to implement surgical techniques to help heal the scars of gender-based violence.
- Joseph Smith Hospital has had continuous success treating many patients. Our hospital provides clean, high-quality, and accessible health care to those in the community. We focus heavily on prenatal, delivery, and postpartum care, which has benefited all of the babies we have delivered.
- Our vocational training center is nearing completion. When completed, our center will provide training in skills such as tailoring, welding, construction, plumbing, networking, and electrical work. The center will also include a computer lab of 40 computers with high-speed internet for use by the community.
